Background & methodology

- This analysis is commissioned by Dansk Energi
- It compares Danish fibre broadband consumer pricing with that of seven comparable European countries:
 - Sweden
 - Norway
 - Germany
 - Netherlands
 - UK
 - Belgium
 - France



- Purchase power adjustment done
- Two largest (fibre) broadband providers covered per country

- All fee components gathered monthly subscription fees and one-time fees
 - Uses the total 2 year fees as the ultimate comparison
- Threshold: At least 100 Mbit/s in download speed
- Two separate cases:
 - New build: A detached house owner connects to fibre for the first time
 - Existing connection: A new consumer subscribes to broadband in a house that already has a fibre connection


The three countries behind Denmark in fibre availability and adoption are Germany, the UK and Belgium. The incumbent operators in these countries did for long resist fibre rollout to instead offer faster xDSL variants. These countries are also well served by modernised HFC (cable TV) networks.

The countries closest to Denmark – figures-wise – are France, the Netherlands, Norway and Sweden. With regards to fibre adoption, Sweden and Norway are well ahead of the other countries.




Overview of pricing analysis






Average monthly subscription fee



3p in France = broadband + TV + fixed telephony All plans unlimited volume except one from Proximus Belgium with 100 GB per month




One-time fee – new build



3p in France – broadband + TV + fixed telephony All plans unlimited volume except one from Proximus Belgium with 100 GB per month




One-time fee – new build (without Sweden)



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
One-time fee – existing connection



All plans unlimited volume except one from Proximus Belgium with 100 GB per month




Total 2 year fee – new build



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
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Total 2 year fee - new build (without Sweden)






Total 2 year fee – existing connection

Conclusions

Denmark has:

- Among the *most* affordable total 2 year fees for a new build fibre customer
- Among the *more* affordable total 2 year fees for an existing connection fibre customer
- Denmark's price position comes even though Danish fibre broadband contracts have minimum contract duration of 6 months – more than 3 months shorter than the average in our markets
- Denmark is also, according to Ookla Speedtest data, providing the <u>fastest average</u> <u>download</u> in its fixed broadband networks



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
